Printing SA (The Printing Industries Federation of South Africa NPC) is committed to a national environmental policy that will ensure full environmental compliance, leading to sustainable development. As the voice of the industry, we will ensure the environmental risks and responsibilities are simplified and understood; take action to improve the environmental management of the operations; and leverage on the business benefits that result from improved environmental practices.

Printing SA is aware of the potential environmental impacts, processes, raw materials, chemicals used, and waste generated. We accept that people and organisations at all levels have obligations and to act responsibly in both our personal lives and for the society and environment at large.

Furthermore, Printing SA has a pivotal position due to its national standing, its intimate relationship with stakeholders and its advocacy being the industry voice. In this sense, we have a duty both to adopt environmental best practices, and to promote appropriate networking technology as an alternative to practices to reduce pollution and emission sources.
